Brief History of the Society

The Society was founded in 1958 by a number of Frome townspeople who realised that there was a need to make the history of Frome and district better known, and to preserve its historic buildings and records.

In 1966 the Society was instrumental in establishing Frome Museum which it ran for some years. Its sub-committees and Historical Research Group gathered information on Frome's history which is deposited at the Museum and Public Library. The Society has played a leading role in conserving historic local buildings, notably Marston House, and has given donations to many local projects. Financial assistance has been given for research. Important relics such as maps and documents have been purchased and maps repaired. A number of plaques have been provided to mark buildings or sites of historic interest.

The Society fully supported and was involved in the setting up of the Frome Town Twinning organisation.

In 1974 Mrs Norman Ashworth bequeathed Wine Street House to the Society. It was used for some years to house Frome Museum, but the house was unendowed and had to be sold and the proceeds invested.

It has published a number of Yearbooks (one copy free to members) that contain many items of historical interest about Frome and the surrounding villages. Please ask for a list of titles currently available when you apply for membership. The Yearbook is edited and compiled by Michael McGarvie, well-known local historian and archivist.

Activities

The committee organises summer and winter programmes of outings and lectures that extend throughout the year. The summer outings are mainly to venues of historic interest and complement the winter lectures, which are given by experts on a variety of subjects of interest to members. Extra trips are arranged occasionally for special exhibitions or events.

A Newsletter is produced twice yearly, containing details of programmes and general information, together with contributions from Frome & District Civic Society. The Civic Society also participates in planning our programmes.
